A core switch forms the high-speed backbone of a well-shaped network, connecting distribution layers and ensuring scalable, reliable, and high-performance data flow.

Role of a Core Switch

A core switch is a high-capacity, Layer 3 switch positioned at the backbone of an enterprise network, responsible for aggregating traffic from distribution switches and providing ultra-low latency and maximum throughput across the network . It acts as the central nervous system of the network, ensuring uninterrupted routing and packet forwarding between different network segments, server farms, and data centers . Unlike access switches, which connect end-user devices, the core switch focuses on high-speed interconnection and backbone traffic management .

Hierarchical Network Architecture

A well-shaped network typically follows a three-tier hierarchical model:

- Access Layer: Connects end-user devices like PCs, IP phones, and Wi-Fi access points. Access switches prioritize high port density and often provide Power over Ethernet (PoE), .
- Distribution (Aggregation) Layer: Aggregates traffic from access switches, applies routing policies, VLAN segmentation, and QoS, and forwards traffic to the core layer .
- Core Layer: Provides high-speed backbone connectivity, linking multiple distribution switches and ensuring minimal latency and maximum throughput. Core switches often use hardware-accelerated routing via ASICs for wire-speed performance
