Circuit distribution boxes come in a wide range of dimensions, typically from compact wall-mounted units around 200 × 200 × 120 mm to large freestanding cabinets exceeding 2200 mm in height, 1800 mm in width, and 600 mm in depth.

Standard Size Ranges

Wall-mounted enclosures: Commonly range from 200 × 200 × 120 mm up to 800 × 600 × 300 mm, suitable for residential, light commercial, or small industrial applications . These sizes accommodate MCBs, RCDs, RCBOs, and other protective devices while leaving space for wiring, cable entries, and future expansion .

Freestanding or floor-standing cabinets: Typically range from 1600–2200 mm in height, 600–1800 mm in width, and 300–600 mm in depth. These are used for larger industrial or commercial power distribution systems, offering more internal space for busbars, control equipment, and high-amperage circuits .

Multi-gang boxes: For smaller installations, single-gang boxes house one device, double-gang for two, and larger multi-gang boxes accommodate multiple circuits. The choice depends on the number of devices, future upgrades, and compliance with local electrical codes .
