

Distribution box circuit broken



Article Overview

A broken circuit in a distribution box is usually caused by a short circuit, faulty wiring, or a defective component, and can be safely resolved by systematic inspection, testing, and repair.

Safety First

Before inspecting the distribution box, turn off the main power to prevent electric shock. Never touch live parts, and use insulated tools when working inside the box .

Diagnosing the Fault

- Check for tripped breakers or blown fuses: Identify which circuit is affected. Reset the breaker or replace the fuse if necessary .
- Inspect wiring and connections: Look for loose screws, damaged insulation, or burnt wires. Ensure all wires are properly seated in terminals and busbars .
- Use a multimeter or voltage tester: Measure voltage at the power supply and along the circuit to locate where current stops or shorts .
- Check appliances and devices: Sometimes a faulty appliance causes the circuit to trip. Disconnect all devices and test the circuit step by step .

Repairing the Circuit

- Replace damaged wires or components: Repair broken wires, replace faulty breakers, fuses, or connectors .
- Secure connections: Tighten loose terminals and ensure proper contact with busbars and neutral/ground bars
