Why Grounding is Necessary

Grounding a distribution box provides a safe path for fault currents and prevents electrical shocks, fires, and equipment damage. It stabilizes the electrical system by allowing excess electricity to safely dissipate into the earth, protecting both personnel and connected devices. Even if the box is made of metal, grounding is essential because accidental contact with live wires or static buildup can make the enclosure hazardous.

Grounding Standards and Practices

- All distribution boxes and controllers must be grounded. In the US, a 10 AWG (5.26 mm²) ground wire is typically used, while other markets may require a 6 mm² wire.
- Metal enclosures and doors: The metal box and any metallic doors should be bonded to the grounding system using dedicated grounding screws or clips. This ensures that all accessible metal parts are at the same potential and safe to touch.
- Internal components: Electrical components inside the box that require grounding must be connected to the PE (protective earth) bus, which is itself connected to the main grounding system.
- Subpanels: In subpanels, the neutral and ground must remain separate, and the g...
