Direct Fiber Connection Options

If fiber optic service is available but no Ethernet cabling exists in your premises, you can still distribute the connection using the following methods:

- **Optical Network Terminal (ONT):** Fiber service typically terminates at an ONT, which converts the optical signal into electrical signals. Most ONTs provide at least one Ethernet port for connecting a router or switch .
- **Fiber Media Converters:** These devices convert fiber signals to Ethernet, allowing you to connect standard network devices without running new fiber to each endpoint .
- **Fiber-to-Wi-Fi Routers:** Some routers have built-in SFP ports or fiber interfaces. Connecting the fiber directly to such a router allows you to create a wireless network throughout your home or office, eliminating the need for Ethernet cabling .
