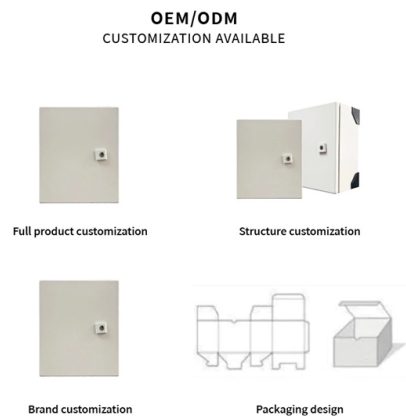

What They Are

Fiber optic HDMI cables, also known as HDMI Active Optical Cables (AOCs), function like standard HDMI cables but use optical fibers instead of copper for the main data transmission. They convert electrical signals into light pulses at the source and back into electrical signals at the display, allowing for long-distance, high-speed data transfer without the need for signal boosters or repeaters. These cables typically include a few copper wires for low-speed signaling and power, along with shielding to prevent interference.

Advantages Over Copper HDMI

- **Longer Reach:** Fiber optic HDMI cables can transmit data up to 200 feet (61 meters), compared to copper HDMI cables, which are limited to about 25 feet (7.6 meters) without amplifiers.
- **High Bandwidth:** They support speeds up to 18 Gbps, sufficient for 4K resolution at 60 Hz and high-quality audio.
- **Signal Integrity:** Immune to electromagnetic interference (EMI), ensuring stable video and audio quality over long distances.
- **Lightweight and Flexible:** Optical fibers allow the cable to be thinner and easier to route through walls or conduits
