Overview of Vertical Shaft Distribution

Vertical shafts, also called risers, are dedicated conduits or shafts in buildings that carry electrical cables and other utilities from the main supply to each floor . In large buildings, the vertical supply system (rising mains) is a key part of the electrical distribution network, connecting the main low-voltage or high-voltage boards to floor-level distribution boards . The arrangement of these shafts depends on the building size, shape, and load distribution, and must be coordinated with architectural design to ensure proper cable routing and safety .

Types of Vertical Shaft Distribution Boxes

- **Single Rising Main:** A single vertical main cable or bus duct runs through the shaft, supplying all floors. It is simple and cost-effective, but a fault affects all floors, offering low supply security .
- **Grouped Supply:** Floors are divided into groups, each served by a separate vertical main. This balances loads within each group and limits the impact of faults to a few...
