1. Fire Resistance Rating Choose a cable tray with a fire rating appropriate for your application. Ratings such as EI 60, 90, or 120 indicate the duration (in minutes) the tray can maintain fire integrity. International standards like UL 94 or IEC 60695-5-11 provide guidance on material performance under fire conditions. Higher-rated trays are recommended for critical installations to ensure safety and continuity of service .

2. Material Selection

- Steel (GI or HDG): Robust, high load-bearing capacity, excellent fire performance, suitable for industrial environments. May require coatings for corrosion protection .
- Aluminum: Lightweight, corrosion-resistant, easier to handle, but slightly lower fire resistance than steel .
- Fiberglass (FRP): Non-corrosive, excellent fire ratings, ideal for chemical plants or coastal areas, but lower load capacity .

3. Tray Design and Heat Management

- Perforated or ladder-type trays improve ventilation and heat dissipation, reducing fire risk .
