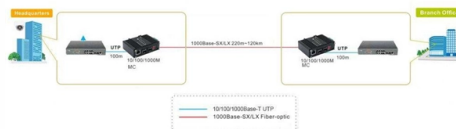


How to calculate pigtail and patch cord costs



Article Overview

Calculating pigtail and patch cord costs involves determining the required quantity, selecting cable types and connectors, and factoring in labor and additional components.

Step 1: Determine Quantity Needed

The first step is to calculate how many patch cords or pigtails your network requires. Consider the following factors:

- **Network Topology:** Star topologies require more patch cords than ring or bus topologies.
 - **Device Ports:** Count the number of fiber ports on switches, servers, and other devices. For example, a 24-port switch typically needs 24 patch cords for full connectivity, plus any redundancy .
 - **Patch Panel Design:** Cross-connect setups require cords between devices and patch panels, as well as between patch panels themselves.
 - **Redundancy Factor:** Include extra cords for backup (commonly 0-1 per connection).
 - **Spare and Future Expansion:** Reserve 10-30% additional cords for maintenance and growth .
- Formula Example: Total patch cords = (Ports on Device A + Ports on Device B) × (1 + Redundancy factor) + Spare cords
