

How to check the bandwidth of a core switch

You can check the bandwidth of a core switch using CLI commands, SNMP monitoring, or traffic analysis tools like NetFlow Analyzer to measure interface-level utilization and throughput.

Using CLI Commands

For Cisco switches, you can use the following commands:

- Show interface summary: Provides an overview of bandwidth utilization for all interfaces, including bits per second (bps) and packets per second (pps), as well as dropped packets .
- Show interface [interface-id]: Displays detailed statistics for a specific port, including input/output rates and errors. For example, show interface gi1/0/40 shows the bandwidth usage of that interface .
- Load interval adjustment: You can set the sampling interval to get more accurate real-time readings. For example:
`config tload-interval 30exitshow int gi1/0/1 | include drops|bits` This shows traffic rates and packet drops over a 30-second interval .

Using SNMP Monitoring

- SNMP (Simple Network Management Protocol) allows you to pull bandwidth and performance data from the switch remotely
