

How to connect a two-core fiber optic cable junction box



Article Overview

You can connect a two-core fiber optic cable to a junction box using either fusion splicing, mechanical splicing, or field-fit connectors, depending on your equipment and skill level.

Preparation

- **Safety First:** Wear gloves and safety glasses to protect against glass shards from the fiber optic cable .
- **Tools Needed:** Fiber optic stripper, cleaver, cleaning supplies (isopropyl alcohol, lint-free wipes), fusion splicer or mechanical splice kit, and protective sleeves .
- **Cable Preparation:** Strip the outer jacket, buffer, and cladding carefully to expose the fiber cores without damaging them . Clean the fibers thoroughly to remove dust or oils.

Connection Methods

1. Fusion Splicing

- Align the two fiber cores in a fusion splicer.
 - The splicer uses heat to fuse the fibers together, creating a permanent, low-loss connection.
 - After splicing, place a protective sleeve over the joint to secure it .
 - This method is ideal for long-distance or high-performance networks due to minimal signal loss .
