Building a Cable Tray

Materials and Tools Needed:

- Sturdy metal (steel, aluminum) or plastic panels
 - Brackets or supports for wall, ceiling, or floor mounting
 - Screws, anchors, and connectors
 - Tools: saw, drill, measuring tape, level, and safety gear (gloves, goggles)
- Steps to Assemble:

- Plan the Route: Measure the area and mark the cable tray path, considering clearance, load capacity, and cable separation.
- Select Tray Type: Ladder trays allow airflow and easy cable entry; perforated trays support lighter loads; solid-bottom trays protect cables from dust or debris.
- Assemble Panels: Connect side panels, end panels, and any dividers securely with screws. Ensure alignment using a level.
- Install Supports: Mount brackets or supports at intervals (typically 1.5-3 meters) to prevent sagging.
- Lay Cables: Place cables neatly, using ties or Velcro straps to prevent tangling....
