

How to secure cables to the distribution box

Cables should be secured within 12 inches of the distribution box and supported at regular intervals using staples, cable ties, or straps that do not damage the cable.

Safety First

Before handling any cables, turn off the power at the main breaker and verify with a voltage tester that the wires are de-energized. Wear insulating gloves, safety glasses, and slip-resistant shoes to prevent electrical accidents during installation .

Securing Cables

- Proximity to the box: Nonmetallic (NM) or metal-clad (MC) cables must be secured within 12 inches (300 mm) of the box to prevent strain on connectors and maintain proper alignment .
- Support intervals: Along the cable run, secure cables at intervals not exceeding 4.5 feet (1.4 meters) for NM cable or 6 feet (1.8 meters) for MC cable to prevent sagging and movement .
- Fastening methods: Use staples, cable ties, straps, or clamps that are listed for the cable type and installed so they do not damage the insulation or conductors . Avoid stapling flat cables on edge.
