

Is the power supply input line connected to N



Overview

N denotes the neutral conductor — the wire completing the circuit by carrying return current back to the supply. In European systems, neutral uses blue insulation. Figure 1 shows how to connect the power supply's input terminals. Even though AC has no polarity, almost all the power supply AC inputs or most AC powered device input terminals indicate line and neutral terminals as L and N just like in the following example: Is there a fundamental reason to wire line to L and neutral to N but not the other way around?

N is Neutral: Does it mean this wire is connected to ground and so it always 0V compared to ground.
