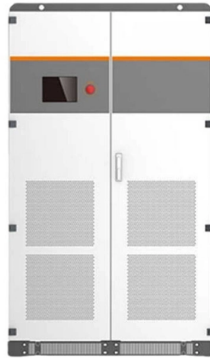


No light coming from the switch's optical module



Article Overview

If your switch's optical module is not producing light, the issue may stem from compatibility, fiber type mismatch, contamination, or a faulty module.

Check Module Compatibility

Ensure the optical module is compatible with your switch. Many switches require certified modules, and third-party modules may not function correctly. Use the switch CLI to verify that the module is recognized. If the switch does not detect the module, the port will not operate, and you may need to contact the module supplier or replace it with a certified module .

Verify Fiber Type

Optical modules must match the fiber type:

- Single-mode modules (typically 1310 nm or 1550 nm, yellow fiber) require single-mode fiber.
- Multimode modules (typically 850 nm, orange or aqua fiber) require multimode fiber. A mismatch can prevent light transmission even if the module is recognized .

Inspect and Clean Connectors

Contaminated or scratched optical ports can block light. Clean the optical bores and...
