Article Overview

The transceiver port of an optical module serves as the interface for connecting fiber optic cables, enabling bidirectional conversion between electrical and optical signals.

Function of the Transceiver Port

The transceiver port is the optical interface of an optical module, allowing it to transmit and receive light signals through fiber optic cables. It acts as the gateway between the internal electrical circuitry of networking equipment (like switches or routers) and the external fiber network, facilitating high-speed data transmission by converting electrical signals into optical signals (E-O conversion) and vice versa (O-E conversion) .

Structure and Components

Optical modules are typically hot-pluggable and include several key components associated with the transceiver port:

- Transmit Optical Bore (Tx): Sends optical signals out through the fiber .
- Receive Optical Bore (Rx): Captures incoming optical signals and converts them back to electrical signals .
- Connector: Provides a secure physical interface for the fiber cable, ensuring proper alignment and signal integrity .
- Dust Plug: Protects the port from contamination when not in use, preventing signal loss or damage .
- Latch or Spring Mechanism: Secures the module in the device port and allows eas...
