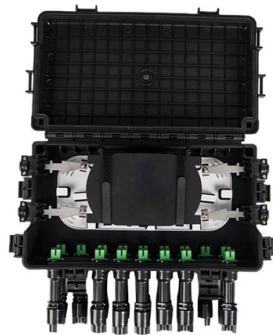


Problems Encountered in the Development of Fiber Optic Communication

High Initial Costs

Environmental regulations may require special permits and compliance with protection standards, leading to project delays and higher costs.
