

Selection Guide for QSFP Fiber Ethernet Switches for Base Stations



Article Overview

Choosing the right QSFP fiber Ethernet switch for base stations requires evaluating module type, port density, fiber compatibility, transmission distance, power requirements, and vendor interoperability.

Key Considerations

1. QSFP Module Type and Speed QSFP modules come in multiple generations: QSFP+ (40G), QSFP28 (100G), QSFP56 (200G), and QSFP-DD (400G). Each generation supports higher data rates and may be backward compatible with older modules. For base stations, QSFP28 or QSFP-DD modules are often preferred due to higher throughput and future-proofing for 5G and edge deployments . 2. Port Density and Form Factor Base stations often require compact switches with high port density. QSFP-DD switches provide double-density ports, supporting 8 lanes of 50 Gbps PAM4 signaling per port for 400 Gbps aggregate bandwidth. Ensure the switch cage design supports the intended module type and allows backward compatibility with QSFP28 or QSFP+ if needed . 3. Fiber Type and Transmission Distance Select modules based on fiber type (single-mode or multi-mode) and required reach. For example, QSFP+ SR4 modules support short-reach MMF up to 150 m, while LR4 or ER4 modules support long-reach SMF up to 2 km or more. Base station deployments may require a mix of short and long-reach optics depending on fronthaul and backhaul connections . 4. Power Consumption and Thermal Management QSFP-DD modules typically consume 10-25W per port, while older QSFP28 modules consume less. Ensure the switch can supply sufficient power and has adequate cooling to maintain reliability i...
