

Should there be a reserved space for cables to enter the distribution box

Reserve sufficient space and use protective measures like grommets, spacers, or removable end plates to ensure safe, organized, and code-compliant cable entry into a distribution box.

Planning Cable Entry Space

When designing or installing a distribution box, it is essential to reserve extra space for cables to enter safely. This includes:

- Allowing clearance around the box: Maintain at least 1 meter of space around the distribution box for inspection, maintenance, and future expansion .
- Considering future load growth: Leave room for additional cables or modular expansion to avoid repeated modifications .
- Proper placement: Install the box in dry, accessible areas with good ventilation, away from water, flammable materials, or heat sources .

Protecting Cables at Entry Points

Cables entering the distribution box must be protected from sharp edges to prevent insulation damage and comply with wiring regulations:

- Deburring edges: Smooth any sharp edges of the box or trunking before passing cables through
