

Weight requirements for fireproof cable trays



Article Overview

The weight of a fireproof tray-type cable tray depends on its material, dimensions, and design, typically ranging from 10 to 50 kg per meter for steel-based trays, with lighter options for aluminum or FRP.

Factors Affecting Weight

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Material:

- Mild Steel / Galvanized Steel: $\sim 7,850 \text{ kg/m}^3$
- Stainless Steel (SS304/SS316): $\sim 8,000 \text{ kg/m}^3$
- Aluminum: $\sim 2,700 \text{ kg/m}^3$
- Fiberglass Reinforced Plastic (FRP): $\sim 1,800\text{--}2,000 \text{ kg/m}^3$

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Tray Type:

- Solid Bottom Tray: Heavier due to full sheet metal coverage.
- Perforated Tray: Weight reduced by $\sim 20\%$ due to perforations.
- Ladder Tray: Weight depends on side rails and rung spacing (typically 200–300 mm).
- Wire Mesh Tray: Weight depends on wire diameter and grid spacing .
