A fiber optic pigtail is a short optical fiber with a pre-installed connector on one end and a bare fiber on the other. The connector end plugs directly into devices such as optical distribution frames (ODFs), patch panels, terminal boxes, or active network equipment, providing a reliable interface for signal transmission . The bare fiber end is designed to be fusion spliced or mechanically spliced to the incoming fiber optic cable, creating a permanent, low-loss connection .

- **Active Equipment:** The connector end of the pigtail can plug into switches, routers, or optical transceivers, enabling the optical signal to enter the active network devices .
- **Patch Panels:** Pigtails are often terminated in patch panels, where they interface with patch cords to connect different network segments or devices
