

What does a yellow fiber optic pigtail mean

A yellow fiber optic pigtail is a single-mode fiber cable with a factory-terminated connector on one end and a bare fiber on the other, used for splicing into optical networks.

Definition and Structure

A fiber optic pigtail is a short optical fiber, typically 0.5 to 2 meters long, with a factory-installed connector on one end and a bare fiber on the other for splicing into a fiber optic cable in the field. The connector end plugs into devices such as transceivers, patch panels, or optical distribution frames (ODFs), while the bare end is designed for fusion or mechanical splicing, ensuring minimal signal loss and high performance.

Color Coding

The yellow jacket specifically indicates that the pigtail is a single-mode fiber (SMF) with a 9/125 micron core/cladding diameter. This color coding helps technicians quickly identify the fiber type during installation and maintenance. In contrast, multimode fibers are typically orange (OM1/OM2) or aqua (OM3/OM4) to distinguish them from single-mode fibers.
