

What is double grounding in a distribution box

Double grounding of a distribution box refers to connecting the box to two separate grounding paths to ensure safety and reduce electrical resistance.

Explanation

Double grounding is a safety measure used in electrical distribution systems to protect both equipment and personnel. In a distribution box, this involves attaching one ground wire from the box to a mounting plate and a second ground wire from the mounting plate to a central or factory grounding point . This creates two parallel paths for fault currents, which helps maintain a low total ground resistance, typically less than 0.1 ohm, ensuring effective dissipation of electrical faults .

Purpose

- **Safety:** Provides a reliable path for fault currents, reducing the risk of electric shock or fire .
- **Equipment Protection:** Prevents damage to sensitive electronics by stabilizing voltage and dissipating surges or lightning strikes .
- **Redundancy:** If one grounding path fails due to corrosion, loose connections, or damage, the second path maintains grounding continuity .
