

What router is needed to connect fiber optic cables

To connect fiber optic cables, you need a fiber-ready router with Gigabit Ethernet support, WAN port for an ONT, and modern Wi-Fi standards like Wi-Fi 6 or 7.

Key Requirements for a Fiber-Ready Router

- **High-Speed Capability:** The router must support at least Gigabit Ethernet (1000 Mbps) to handle the high bandwidth of fiber connections . For multi-gig fiber plans, routers with multi-gigabit LAN/WAN ports are recommended .
- **WAN Port for ONT:** Fiber connections often require an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) to convert the fiber signal into data usable by your router. A fiber-ready router should have a WAN port compatible with the ONT .
- **Advanced Wireless Technology:** Modern routers with Wi-Fi 6 or Wi-Fi 7 provide faster wireless speeds, better coverage, and support for multiple devices simultaneously, which is essential for maximizing fiber internet performance .
- **Sufficient LAN Ports:** For wired devices like desktops, gaming consoles, or NAS systems, a router with at least 4 Ethernet LAN ports is recommended. Some high-end routers support LAN aggregation for even faster wired speeds .
- **Optional Built-in Modem or Fiber Interface:** Some routers come with a built-in optical interface, allowing direct connection to fiber without a separate ONT, though this depends on your ISP .
