

What to do if your router's fiber optic cable is faulty

If your router's fiber optic cable is not working, start by inspecting physical connections, cleaning connectors, testing signal strength, and checking device functionality.

Step 1: Inspect Physical Connections

Check the fiber optic cable for visible damage, such as cuts, bends, or fraying, and ensure connectors are securely seated in both the router and the optical network terminal (ONT) or modem. Avoid sharp bends that can break fibers internally, and make sure the cable is not pinched or crushed. If you notice damage, replace the cable with a high-quality fiber optic cable.

Step 2: Clean Connectors

Fiber connectors can accumulate dust, oil, or debris, which can block the optical signal. Use lint-free wipes and isopropyl alcohol or a fiber cleaning pen to clean both ends of the cable. Reinsert the connectors firmly, ensuring proper alignment.

Step 3: Check Device Indicators

Look at the LED indicators on your router, ONT, or transceivers. A "LOS" (Loss of Signal) light indicates the device is not receiving a valid optical signal. Ensure the power LED is on and the PON or Data LEDs are active. If lights are off or red, the iss...
