

Which electrical distribution boxes in buildings need to be grounded



Overview

20 (B) of the 2020 NEC alternating-current (AC) systems of 50 volts to 1000 volts must be grounded which means referenced to earth. Section 250. 4 (A) (1) explains, electrical systems connect to ground to limit voltage imposed from lightning strikes, line surges, high-voltage crossovers and to stabilize voltage-to-ground under normal operation. Can a Junction Box Be Covered?

Yes — but: It must remain accessible. It cannot be buried. Grounded or grounding, as defined in the 2020 edition of NFPA 70 ®, National Electrical Code® (NE C®), Article 100, is connecting to ground or to a conductive body that extends the ground connection.
